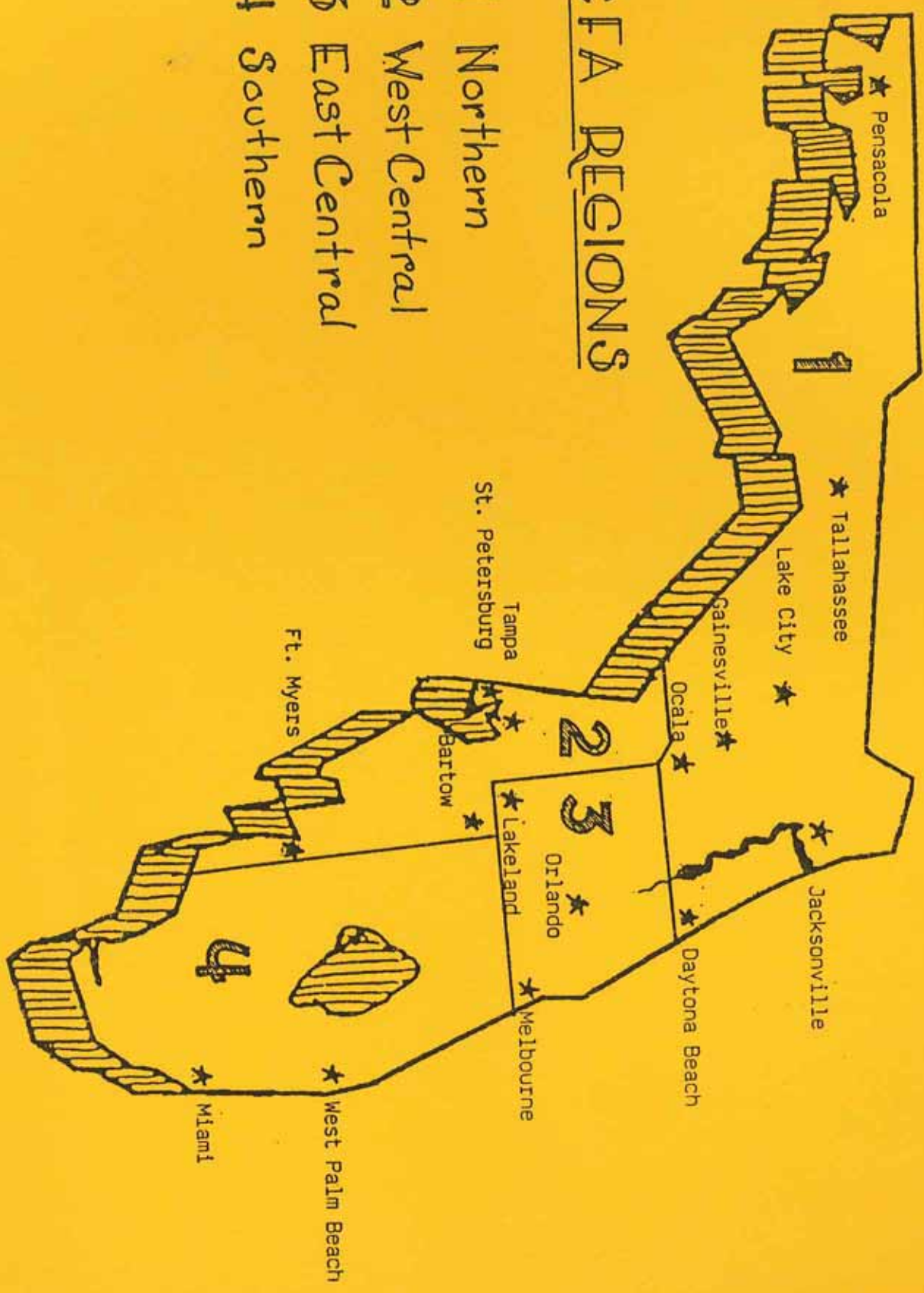

General Membership Meeting

Richard Evans nominated Jim Aggeles for 2nd Vice-President. Dan Burek seconded. Motion carried.

Kurt Miller nominated Richard Evans for secretary. Jim Aggeles seconded. Dan Burek closed the nomination. Motion carried. Dan McDaniel nominated Sharon Fosbinder for Treasurer. Luis Tamayo seconded. Motion carried.

Milton Reid moved that the nominations for officers close. Jim Aggeles seconded. Motion carried.

Clive Cork was complimented by the general membership for the great job he had done as President. Clive thanked the membership and stated "It was an enjoyable experience." He also stated that "We must stay vigilant with coming to the meetings."

Jon Crull motioned to adjourn the meeting. Will Massey seconded.

Rob Rickey disputed the idea that additives do not have the ability to clog filters. Clive mentioned that the water problems will evaporate with the heat of the engine. Luis Tamayo brought to light the necessity of oil manufacturers and vehicle manufacturers setting the standards for oil changes and the recovery of used oil. Charles Huntsberry talked about his new element device for the purpose of oil recovery. (marketed as non-hazardous) Discussion ensued.
